Legacy mural at OHHS

On May 21, members of the Oak Hills High School social studies department participated in a professional learning experience led by Northern Kentucky University faculty members, Dr. William Landon and Dr. Sharyn Jones, as well as NKU student and Oak Hills graduate, Chelsea Hauser '15.

The staff visited the excavation site of Parker Academy (located in New Richmond), one of America's first co-education, racially integrated schools, founded in 1839. The teachers learned about the excavation and archeological process, the cataloging of artifacts and discussed Parker Academy's connection with the Underground Railroad and other significant, historical milestones.



OHLSD on the August ballot

On Monday, May 7, 2018, the Oak Hills School Board passed a resolution to place a 4.9 mill operating levy on the August 7 ballot.

In the wake of recent school safety tragedies, district and building leadership teams have collaborated with local law enforcement agencies and security professionals to assist in identifying increased safety measures to ensure a safe and secure environment for all students and staff. In addition, Mr. Bart West, retired Green Township Police Chief, worked across the district to provide a full safety audit of all district facilities. Through engagement and assistance from local law enforcement, administrators, staff and student groups, the district completed the audit and presented recommendations to the Oak Hills School Board during their development meeting on May 21.

In anticipation of taking immediate action to address high priority and pressing security issues, based on recent community survey feedback and recommendations from Mr. West, the district finds it necessary to go to the voters this August to meet prioritized needs. In addition to safety and security measures, the district is also committed to assisting students with psychological and mental health needs.

The 4.9 mill levy will preserve the financial stability of the district and allow the district to implement important safety and security building enhancements as well as mental health interventions.
